

Why a Plan is Needed

- Construction progress on three new schools in Auburn Bay and Mahogany currently indicates the possibility of an opening in September 2022. We hope to confirm the opening date shortly.
- In the event a September 2022 opening is possible, a plan has been developed that will allow many students to attend school closer to home.
- This plan will require an adjustment of boundaries and designations for Auburn Bay, Seton and Mahogany families.





Rationale for This Plan



Addresses key CBE planning principles:





- Allows students to attend school closer to home.
- Provides program continuity from kindergarten to Grade 12.
 - Provides equitable access for all students to quality learning environments and choice of programs.
 - Uses space and resources effectively.

Community Stats







Auburn Bay

- Is considered fully built out and has an estimated population of 18,600 - 18,900 people.
- Has three CBE school sites (Auburn Bay School, elementary school # 2 and a middle school).

Mahogany

- Is 37 per cent built out with a population of 11,784 in 2019.
- Planned for an estimated population of 28,300-30,400 but pace of development has been slow.
- Has three CBE school sites (two elementary schools, including Mahogany School, and a middle school).

Seton

- Is only 5 per cent built out with a population of 1,134 in 2019.
- Planned for an estimated population of 20,500 to 21,700 persons.
- Has three CBE school sites (a future middle, a future elementary and Joane Cardinal Schubert High School).













2nd Elementary - 5 Year Projection Kindergarten to Grade 5 - Mahogany Overflow











Transportation and Walk Zones

 The name of Mahogany School has already been confirmed by our previous Board of Trustees.

New School Registration







- Online registration for the 2022-2023 school year.
- Information forthcoming on the CBE website closer to opening of registrations on Jan. 17, 2022.
- Current K-7 Auburn Bay, Mahogany and Seton students who attend Andrew Sibbald, Auburn Bay, Nickle, Riverbend and Sherwood schools will automatically be registered in their new schools for the 2022-2023 school year.
- If students will be designated to a different school and would like to transfer from an alternative program or out of attendance area school, they will need to inform their current school and submit a Transfer Request Form.

Can we open the Auburn Bay middle school with Grade 9?



Traditionally new middle schools open without Grade 9 to allow current Grade 8 students to finish at their current school. However, this is something we may be able to consider.

Questions So Far







We live in Mahogany and my child is in Riverbend School for Grade 5 or Grade 6, how will they be designated next year? Students will be automatically enrolled in the new Auburn Bay middle school for Grades 6 and 7 for the 2022-2023 school year.

My child is currently attending (Andrew Sibbald / Nickle / Riverbend / Sherwood), can they continue attending at this school?

Students will automatically be enrolled at their new school based on the new designations. There may be exceptional circumstances that a parent would need to share with the school principal to determine best placement for that student.

Questions So Far







We are currently attending a different school / school district but are interested in attending a school in (Mahogany / Auburn Bay / Cranston) where and when can we register?

Registration for the 2022-2023 school year will open on January 17, 2022, at which point parents may register their child(ren).

Registration and admission to CBE schools is governed by the *Education Act* and <u>Administrative</u> <u>Regulation 6090 | Child and Student Registration and</u> <u>Admission</u>.
